### **Making Things New**

We have already started to see changes - Zion's refreshed sign, Zion's new parking lot, new faces and voices serving during worship on Sunday mornings. Just as each new day brings changes to the trees, each new day brings changes for ministry, changes for outreach and mission and fellowship. There are so many ways God is calling us to see (and be) the changes - are we listening?

### Council Meeting Minutes - September 9, 2025

Zion Council met in the Barb Moellman Media Center on Tuesday, Sept. 9, 2025, at 7 PM. Rusty opened the meeting with prayer and devotions, Philippians 2:1-4 and "Listening to our Neighbors". There was one addition to the agenda. Stacie moved, seconded by Dave to approve the agenda with the addition of budget discussion, motion approved.

More review and access is needed so that I can be comfortable understanding what is required and when. I spoke with Linda Long about the Altar Guild and had a brief discussion on how it works. Catechism (beginning in 6th grade) is taught by Judy Fisher and Rusty Burkett.


High School (after student is Confirmed) is taught by Jeff Lemke.


### Kids' Night Out
